1st Call for Proposals within CBC Serbia – Bosnia and Herzegovina 2014-2020 was closed on 16th November 2017. The Call has been published with the aim to improve sustainable environmental planning, to promote biodiversity, and to strengthen the cultural identity of the Programme area. The evaluation process is still ongoing, and the four projects have been contracted until now. Implementation of the projects started at the beginning of 2019. 

Social integration through parasport– Parainspired





Majority of the applicants came from the programme area. Applicants coming from outside of the programme area are positioned differently in two countries. In Serbia they are concentrated in two political and economic centers (Belgrade and Novi Sad) while in Bosnia and Herzegovina they are more dispersed, however still coming from larger municipalities and cities.



The largest number of lead applicants come from non-governmental sector. The majority of applicants coming from the non-governmental sector, and they are positioned in large centres while others are positioned throughout programme area.


Available and requested amounts per Thematic Priorities under the 1st CfP





The amount of EUR 5,400,000 available for the 1st Call for Proposals was divided on selected Specific Objectives/Thematic Priorities. In according with information collected from project proposals it can be concluded the interest of the potential applicants was far larger than the available amounts.

Amount of grant requested in EUR under the 1st CfP



The grant amounts which could have been requested under the 1st Call of Proposal were set from EUR 120.000 to 1.000.000 depending on the specific objectives and results. Requested amounts varied in this range, however it is notable that more applicants are keen towards smaller grants rather than a large ones. The largest number of requested grants were in the range between 250.000,00 and 500.000,00 EUR, total of 45 which is 40,45 % out of the total requested sum. The next range that was interesting for the applicants were grants in the amounts lower than 250.000,00 EUR, total of 33 or 29,73%. The rest were larger grants those over 750.000,00 EUR, total of 18 or 16,22% and those between 500.000,00 and 750.000,00 EUR, total of 14 or 12,61%. Overall, 70% of grants were those below half a million while only 30% were those over half a million of Euro.
